President's Remarks



Dear fellow researchers, scientists and friends of Selenium!

At the end of this year, we look back and shake our heads in disbelief. A worldwide pandemic has struck, to an extent we only knew from a particular genre of films in the movie theatres, where a gentle sense of horror developed and moved us deeply for a short period of time. Now, this horror has become real, we have to observe losses and to face an unprecedented challenge ahead of us. As a team, we nevertheless have to take it as it is, and to convert it into a positive opportunity, as far as possible. At least for science and technology, we witness an increasing appreciation and acceptance in the majority of the population, and more and more political decisions are becoming based and explained by scientific insights, facts and projections. However, here and now, it is not the place for intensive political discussion, but for us and our society.

May we start this newsletter expressing our sincere appreciation and gratitude to two important figures of our International Society for Selenium Research (ISSR) - two colleagues who shaped our society, the appearance in public and our financial backbone, without whom the ISSR would not have flourished as it did. Both have served our society since the very first days as President and Treasurer, respectively. The idea for our ISSR was born during the 2nd International Conference on Selenium in the Environment and Human Health (ICSEHH), which was held in Suzhou, China, during 23-28 October 2011. It was a wonderful come together, and many of us had the honor to attend and to learn the broad, fascinating and enjoyable facets of this type of meeting. We realized that having a group comprised of inspiring and charming colleagues who all are interested in selenium was the excellent opportunity to form a long-lasting and stable selenium research society. The years went by, our society grew and its council worked diligently, efficiently, and successfully to keeping it alive and kicking.

According to our bylaws, the time came to elect some new officers at the end of 2019. The election results are found later in text where all new and continuing delegates are introducing themselves. For our part, as newly elected President and Vice Presidents, we now have the honor, duty and sweet burden to steer our society and help to develop it further. One of our first and very pleasant duties was decided on during a fast online discussion with an unanimous vote among the new council members in 2020, concerning the offering of honorary membership and a token of appreciation to the two colleagues mentioned above. Accordingly, we would hereby now like to appoint and proclaim the following two fellows to becoming our first lifelong Honorary Members of the International Society for Selenium Research. Both will receive as symbol of our appreciation the mooncolored Silver Medal of Selenium, to be presented to Dr. Gary Banuelos and Dr. Zhi-Oing Lin at our next convention, hopefully in 2022 in Berlin, Germany. In case we will not be able to meet in person, depending on the further development of the pandemic, we will organize a meeting in a hybrid form where local sub-divisions meet in person and the full society in virtual seminars, lectures and discussion rooms. It will for sure dampen some of our vibrant, controversial and most entertaining never-ending face-to-face discussions and interactions, but challenges are to be mastered and they offer a chance for new and delightful developments. Luckily, we do not yet have to decide on our next meeting, but we will do so in summer 2021, when a better global picture on the epidemiology, prevention and vaccination strategies and success is at hand. As additional information, the 12th International Symposium on Selenium in Biology and Medicine initially scheduled for early 2021 in Hawaii has been re-scheduled to December 1-5, 2021, but again, hard to predict whether it will be face-to-face.

The next pleasant duty refers to a very bright, most sincere and highly deserved Thank You to *Professor Dongli Liang* and her team for organizing a fantastic, smoothly running and most enjoyable *6th International Conference on Selenium in the Environment and Human Health*, which took place on October 27-30, 2019 in Yangling/Xi'an, China. It was another great event in the history of our society, and more information and conference photos can be found in this newsletter and also on the conference website. The time and place for this event was chosen wisely and fortunate, ahead of the problems that should throw a shadow on our planned 2020 activities. The conference was characterized again by a sense and quest for fruitful interactions, collaborations and exchange, the key ingredients needed for successful meetings. A large number of young, helpful and highly motivated local students with an obvious thirst for deeper knowledge of Se and its biological and medical roles was again patiently guiding the foreigners through the area and the meeting. How to Become a Member?

Membership is open to all who are interested in fostering the expansion of communication and scientific exchange of new and emerging concepts centered within the multi-disciplines associated with current and future worldwide selenium research efforts. The membership will include regular, student and honorary members. A regular member has the right to elect, or to be elected, as an officer of the ISSR. To join the ISSR, individuals will need to complete the membership application form. The membership due for a regular member is \$50 (USD) for a two-year membership, and \$20 (USD) for a student member. For a lifelong membership the membership due is \$300 (USD).

How to Pay Your Membership Fee?

The membership due of \$50 (for a regular member for two years), \$20 (for a student member for two years), or \$300 (for lifelong membership) can be paid via the following approaches: (i) The payment can be made in cash at the selenium conference; (ii) The fund can be transferred through Western Union or other companies with money transfer service; or (iii) Remitting the payment in the form of a cashier's check, certified check, or money order payable to: *International Society for Selenium Research*. Congratulations to the Successful 6th International Conference on Selenium in the Environment and Human Health

October 27-30, 2019, Northwest A&F University, Yangling/Xian, China

The 6th International Conference on Selenium in Environment the and Human Health was successfully held at Northwest A&F University in Yangling/Xi'an, China on October 27-30, 2019. Over 240 selenium researchers, government



officials, and enterprise representatives from 20 countries participated in this conference. There were more than 140 extended abstracts submitted to the conference for consideration, and 103 extended abstracts were selected, after peer reviews, for publication in the conference proceedings entitled "Selenium Research for Environment and Human Health: Perspectives, Technologies and Advancements" published by CRC press.

A total of 46 oral presentations were scheduled, along with 36 research posters, during the 3-day conference time. The research topics included biogeochemistry of selenium,

effects of selenium on animal and human health, biological and accumulation of selenium, selenium uptake biofortification, cellular and molecular functions of selenium. and selenium pollution and control. Both oral and poster presentations reflected the latest progress in selenium research worldwide. Indeed, this conference provided an effective platform for selenium researchers to conduct indepth discussions and exchanges around the theme of "selenium's multi-faceted and interactive impact on the environment and biological systems". For the very first time under the leadership of Dr. Linxi Yuan, the conference has also organized a special session - Graduate Selenium Research for nearly 60 graduate students. The special session included 12 student oral presentations. The conference has also selected the students for the best poster awards and the best oral presentation awards.

STUDENT AWARDS

During the 6th International Conference on Selenium in the Environment and Human Health in Yangling/Xi'an, China, a special session of student oral presentation was organized by Dr. Linxi Yuan, Associate Professor at Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University in Suzhou, China. The special student session was held on 19:00-22:00 of October 28, 2019. Six faculty served as judge for the Student Presentation Award, including Dr. Joel Caton from North Dakota State University, Dr. Huafen Li from China Agriculture University, Dr. Tao Yu from China Geoscience University (Beijing), Dr. Xiaohu Zhao from Huazhong Agriculture University, Dr. Haibo Qin from Institute of Geochemistry, Chinese Academy of Sciences, and Dr. Julie Tolu from Swiss Federal Institute of Aquatic Science and Technology in Sweden.

There were 12 oral presentations by graduate students, and three students were selected to win *the Best Oral Presentation Award*: **Aryeh Feinberg**, Swiss Federal Institute of Aquatic Science and Technology, "Modelling Atmospheric Selenium Transport and Deposition on a Global Scale"; **Jun Li**, Ghent University, "Exploration of Selenium-Rich Bioproducts Generated from (Waste) Water as Micronutrient Fertilizers"; Chandnee Ramkissoon, University of Nottingham, "Effect of Soil Properties and Contact Time on Selenium Transfer to Wheat".
